- Check for pest droppings, nests, or chewed wiring.
- Confirm vents are unobstructed and screens intact.
- Look for mold or mildew on joists or walls.

Attic Checklist

- Inspect underside of roof for leaks or water stains.
- Check around chimneys, vents, skylights for gaps.
- Ensure insulation is even, dry, and sufficient.
- Check vents for airflow and remove blockages.
- Look for signs of rodents or pests.
- Seal small openings where pests may enter.
- Ensure wiring is safe with no exposed or frayed wires.
- Keep stored items away from insulation and electrical parts.



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Seasonal Tips

- Spring Inspect for water damage after winter storms.
- Summer Check ventilation to prevent heat buildup.
- Fall Ensure insulation is ready for colder months.
