
## PROTECT YOUR HOME BEFORE WINTER DAMAGE SETS IN

- ✓ Bring a flashlight ✓ Wear gloves and closed-toe shoes ✓ Look only—do not disturb insulation or wiring ✓ If something looks wrong, stop and call a professional
  - 1. Cold Floors Above the Crawlspace
  - □ Floors feel noticeably colder in winter
  - □ Certain rooms are harder to keep warm
  - □ Drafts near floor vents or baseboards
    Why it matters: Cold air and missing
    insulation allow heat to escape, driving up
    energy bills and reducing comfort.
  - 2. Musty or Damp Odors Inside the Home
  - □ Persistent musty smell
  - □ Odor strongest in winter or rainy weather
  - □ Smell worsens near floors or vents Why it matters: Odors often indicate trapped moisture, mold, or poor air circulation in the crawlspace.

- 3. Damp, Sagging, or Fallen Insulation
- □ Insulation hanging down
- □ Dark spots or staining
- □ Insulation feels heavy or compressed
  Why it matters: Wet insulation no longer
  insulates and can trap moisture against wood
  framing.
- 4. Condensation or Moisture on Surfaces
- □ Water droplets on pipes or foundation walls
- □ Frost buildup in cold weather
- □ Wood framing looks damp or darkened Why it matters: Condensation leads to wood rot, corrosion, and long-term structural damage.

5. Higher Heating Bills Than Normal

☐ Heating costs spike every winter

□ HVAC system runs constantly

□ No clear explanation for energy increase

Why it matters: An unsealed or poorly insulated crawlspace forces your heating system to work harder.
